

Green Agenda for 2005

1 Mission

To form a team that plays competitive cricket, while also ensuring that opportunities are provided to everyone in the team to participate and improve their cricket skills.

2 Description

The CCCC Green will put together a team that likes to play hard and compete with the best. But this team also has a second important agenda - to ensure that everyone in the team gets chances to play and improve their cricket skills. This team likes to win, and we fancy our chances against any opposition, but the team does not want to do that at the expense of alienating anyone in the team. This is a balancing act that is hard to define accurately as a set of rules. The rules below offer some guidelines to achieve the above objectives.

3 Rules

1. The captain/vice-captain shall be decided by a vote within the team.
2. The maximum number of members in the team is currently not defined. It might be necessary to have such an upper limit, to ensure that everyone gets a fair chance.
3. The team's primary objective is to play competitively, and win every game. Within the confines of this objective, the captain/vice-captain shall try their best to allot playing time to those members who would not make the playing 11 on merit/talent. However, there are no guarantees regarding this. The best way for a member to make the playing 11 for a game is to improve their skills by showing up for practice sessions, which will be regularly monitored by the captain/vice-captain. This method has proven in the past to be both effective and fair. Demanding a place in the side without putting in the necessary effort at practice is strongly discouraged.

4. Team members are expected to recognize that everyone is putting in their best effort, and that this sport is primarily being played for recreational purposes (i.e. noone here is a professional crickteer). Rather than shouting at each other, team members are expected to encourage each other, to bring out the best in each person. Captain should ensure that he maintains control over the game proceedings. Any member who violates team and club policy on behavior, shall be immediately removed from the game.
5. The captain shall ensure that adequate opportunities are given to each team member to practice and improve their skills.
6. Any grievances regarding team selection should be attempted to be resolved within the team, by the team captain, before the issue is presented to club officers.
7. The team shall adhere to all CCCC rules and policies.
